A handmade glass plate with an embedded metal image of a dragon. Size of the plate is 11 x 11 cm. Motif in the glass is laser cut from titanium. The myth of Ljubljana as a city with a dragon as its symbol was created in the third century B.C., when the Argonauts sailed on their ship The Argo under the command of Jason, who had stolen the Golden Fleece. The Argonauts were pursued by King Aeetes from the Black sea to the Rivers Danube and Sava. They sailed all the way to the River Ljubljanica where Jason was met by a swamp monster, the dragon, which he bravely fought and killed. That monster was the green dragon, which now lives on Ljubljana castle and has become the cit crest of Ljubljana. Even today the dragon is one of the most important symbols of Ljubljana

From the patterns of airbricks that can still be seen in the countryside, we have produced a series of clay bases for hot dishes, and they may also decorate your living space.

**A LETTER OPENER
- PROTEUS
ANGINUS**

The tradition of artistic metal forging, preserved in old Kropa, means the continuation of uniquely forged letter openers; their shape preserves the intricate details of "human fish" or proteus anginus. Interests in the human fish (Proteus anginus) reaches back at least to the 17th century, when Johann Weichard Valvasor reported on curious creatures washed up from underground caves which local folk believed to be baby dragons. Scopoli, a naturalist and doctor from Idrija, carefully studied the Proteus and correctly classified it as an amphibian. It was however the Viennese zoologist Laurenti who was the first to describe and name the animal. He named the unusual creature after Greek god Proteus, a servant of the sea. The Proteus was discovered in Slovenia and we have adopted it as the symbol of Slovene natural science.



**A SUN VASE
'POSOČNICA'**

This wide-neck bottle with a wooden lid can be used to store foodstuffs such as sugar, coffee, salt, nuts etc or be used as a vase, with the lid removed. Hand-made bobbin lace - Centuries old tradition of lace making is still alive today in Idrija. Bottle can be filled with energised salt, made in the Sečovlje Salt Pans, one of the loveliest and best preserved parts of Slovenia. The salt is excellent for baths and personal hygiene as salt water helps cleanse the skin.



POTTERY PIPES

The pottery tradition in certain places has been carried on to this day by a few pottery families. They have preserved locally specific and distinctive products, marked by singular ornamentation, colours and even figural solutions. These include pipes made by the Bojc family from Dolenja vas near Ribnica.

HAYRACK

A hayrack is a structure for drying certain produce that is very common in Slovenia. The homeland of hayrack is the wider area of the Alpine world, Northern Europe with Scandinavia, Northern Russia and mountainous Western China and even Japan, but nowhere else are the hayracks so densely erected, typologically diversified and developed as in Slovenia. Hay racks are made by hand, for the most demanding products also spent 30 hours, as consisting of 560 wooden parts.



**A CUP 'VALCEN'
PATTERN 1pc** 22 €

White ceramic cups that are adorned with exquisite patterns that, up until quite recently, wall painters used for decorating the living quarters of a house. These wall painters prepared their own colours by mixing dried earthen colours dug from mines with glue, milk and eggs. They mixed silver colour with egg white, and gold with yolk, to achieve fast colours and a shiny effect. Each wall painter honed and perfected these skills through years of experience and their own resourcefulness.



**THE GLASS
PLATE WITH
IMAGE OF A
SITULA HORSE** 39 €

A handmade glass plate with an embedded metal image of a situla horse (6th century b.c.). The Vače situla - old bronze vessel is the most beautiful world-renowned archaeological find from the Iron Age period and a symbol of Slovenia. It was produced by the northern Illyrians in the site of Vače in Slovenia. Size of the plate is 11 x 11 cm. Motif in the glass is laser cut from titanium.



**A THERMOS CUP

A handmade ceramic cup, made from white or brown clay, wrapped in a hand-knitted jacket from Slovenian homemade wool. The knitted pattern decorates the glass, protects the hands and keeps the liquid warm.
